The UCORE curriculum represents the general education component of a WSU degree and ensures a well-rounded background. Only three, three-credit courses may be

taken from the list of courses required by your major. CAPS courses must be taken in residence; transfer and study abroad courses are not suitable for fulfilling the capstone requirement.
